

## (CSFP)

### **Commodity Supplemental Food Program**

You may be eligible for the commodity supplemental food program. CSFP is a federally funded food distribution program that provides monthly food package. Applicants must reside in Arizona, have a household income at or below 130 % of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines and at least 60 years of age to participate.

*Recipients of other public assistance programs such as AHCCCS may be considered income-eligible for CSFP.*

#### **Documents Needed for Certification**

- 1. Proof of Income (one of the following):**  
Social Security Award letter, Social Security Income letter, a pay stub / bank statement
- 2. Proof of Address** – A current piece of mail with your name and current address
- 3. Proof of Identification – (one of the following):**  
Photo identification, Driver's License or State/Government Issued Identification, Military Identification, Birth Certificate or Passport
